- Updated ICT enabled teaching-learning process should be put in place.

- Independent Computer lab be developed.
- Psychology Laboratory and Science Laboratory be upgraded.
- Short term value added courses should be organized.
- More research projects proposal should be submitted for getting funds from different agencies.
- The college should provide all elective options to students as per the syllabus.
- Feedback mechanism be systematized.
- Faculty members should be trained in the use of innovative methods of teaching and ET.
- Monthly in-house seminars may be organized for academic development of the Faculty.
- Exercises in Reasoning and Thinking should be done at least one period per week.
- Potential of Alumni should be utilized for quality improvement.
